Finally the year 1975-1980 the Barana Community people successfully overcome the disease of hunger for those issues which is that the NATURE ~~provid~~ provides for them. More clean fresh water sources, More fertile soil for gardening and plenty food from the trees and waters are available within the nature which the community live by it.

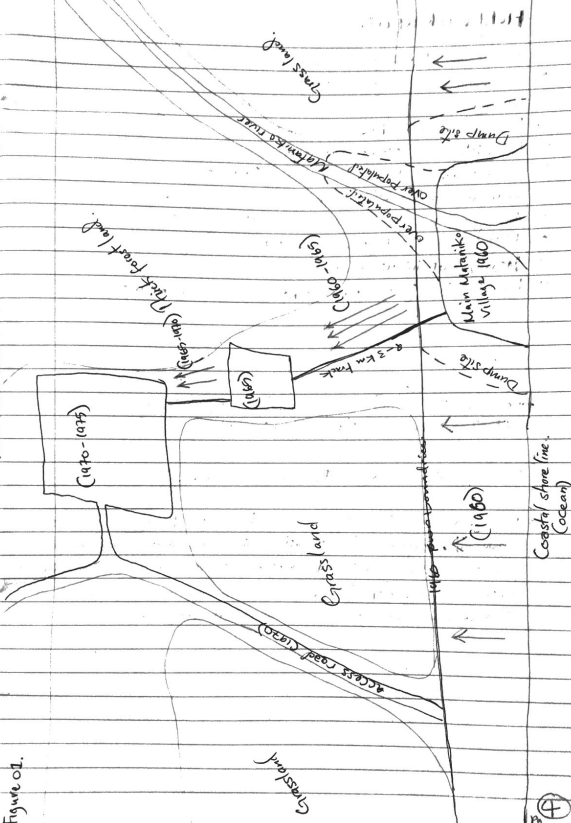

11. Koo Nani	→ Drinking, Washing, Cooking, Swimming

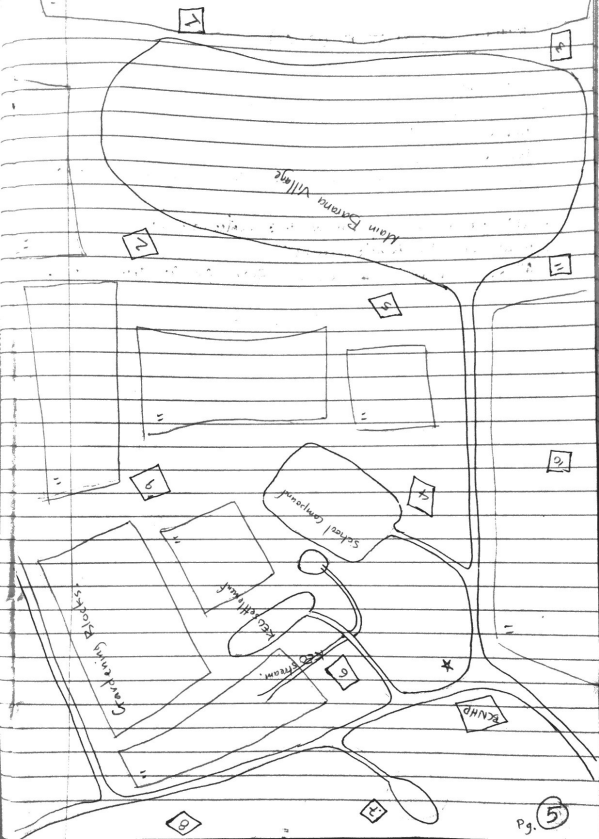
land Blocks
